## District 205 Profile



Lockport Township High School District 205 has the advantage of a storied history and a brilliant future. Central Campus has been enriching students since 1909 and today is the home of freshman students. The addition to East Campus, along with the technological upgrades that followed, gives students an unparalleled opportunity to utilize the most cutting-edge technology available. This mix of historic significance and futuristic technology to which students are exposed at our campuses provides them a unique advantage not available in other districts: two distinct buildings with the same goal of creating a nurturing and challenging environment in which all students achieve success.

Lockport Township High School District 205 is a four-year comprehensive high school district with an enrollment of 3,700 students in grades 9 through 12. Classes are conducted in two buildings: East Campus and Central Campus. The Lockport program is founded upon the 5 A's: academics, arts, applied academics, activities and athletics. With a 1:1, college preparatory program for all students, Lockport Township High School District 205 has been recognized by The Washington Post and U.S. News and World Report as one of the top high schools in the United States for effectively preparing students for college.

## Curriculum

Lockport Township High School District 205 offers a comprehensive secondary school curriculum which includes: College Preparatory Courses, Career/Technology Courses, Advanced Placement Courses, and Honors Courses. A 1.0 credit class meets over the entire year. See reverse side for specific graduation requirements.

**Advanced Placement (AP) course offerings include:** Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science Principles, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, European History, French Language, German Language, Government and Politics: United States, Human Geography, Macroeconomics, Music Theory, Physics 1, Physics 2, Physics C: Mechanics, Psychology, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Statistics, Studio Art: 2-D Design, Studio Art: 3-D Design, Studio Art: Drawing, and United States History.

**Honors course offerings include:** Biology, Chemistry, College Algebra and Trigonometry, Discrete Mathematics, Integrated Math 1, Integrated Math 2, Integrated Math 3, Probability and Statistics, Freshman English: Survey of World Literature, Sophomore English: Survey of American Literature.

**Career Technology course offerings include:** Building Trades, Business Education, Career Internship, Computer Sciences, Culinary Arts, and Vocational Automotive. Some of these courses receive dual credit at local colleges. In addition to Career and Technology course offerings available on campus at both buildings, students are able to enroll in additional classes, many of which offer dual credit courses at Wilco Area Career Center. Wilco course offerings include Fire Science, Veterinary Assistant, Game Design, Computer Technology, Cosmetology, Criminal Justice and Law Enforcement, Emergency Medical Services, and Certified Nursing Assistant.

**Dual Credit Program:** Through articulation programs with Joliet Junior College and College of DuPage, students are able to earn college credit in a number of academic and career and technical courses. These courses are available on campus at the East Campus and through the Wilco Area Career Center.

**Seal of Biliteracy:** Students may earn a Seal of Biliteracy by taking AP language courses, earning a minimum score of 4 on the AP exam and achieving a “meets or exceeds” status on state exams OR by achieving passing scores on language proficiency exams in the areas of reading, writing, speaking and listening and by achieving a “meets or exceeds” status on state exams.
